## NOTES

## **Recommendation Q.105**

### **1.5 NATIONAL (SIGNIFICANT) NUMBER**

1.5.1 In automatic working, the subscriber sends the called subscriber's national (significant) number<sup>1)</sup> by means of a dial, push-button set, or automatic dialling device.

1.5.2 In semi-automatic working, the operator sends the national (significant) number<sup>1)</sup> of the called subscriber by means of a keyset for example.

1.5.3 The outgoing equipment must be designed to cater for a sufficient number of digits in the national (significant) number<sup>1)</sup> as specified in Recommendation Q.11, §§ 2.2 and 3.
