Preface

The Information Security and Privacy Advisory Board (ISPAB or Board) was established in January 1988, pursuant to the Computer Security Act of 1987 (Public Law 100-235; 15 U.S.C. § 278g-4, as amended). The ISPAB is a Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA) committee, and it advises NIST, the Secretary of Homeland Security (DHS), and the Director of the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) on information security and privacy for federal government systems, including through review of proposed standards and guidelines developed by the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST). The Board's authority does not extend to private sector or federal systems which process classified information. NIST values the diverse and highly respected perspectives from the ISPAB members and the Board's sound advice on NIST and the Federal Government's strategic direction, programs, and operations.

This 2021 Annual Report covers the period from the beginning of October 2020 through September 2021 (Fiscal Year 2021).
